Academics & Arts

The Berks Arts Academy Charter Elementary & Middle School will meet or exceed state academic standards. Our professional faculty and administration are dedicated to supporting a variety of diverse learning styles. We offer a robust curriculum and strong core academics. Frequently Asked Questions

Who is eligible to attend?

All Pennsylvania school children are eligible.

Will there be busing?

Yes, in accordance with state determined distance boundaries.

Will there be uniforms?

No, but we will have a dress code.

Will there be a lunch program?

Yes, we will adhere to the PA public school lunch guidelines.

What are the school hours?

Tentatively the school hours are 9:00am – 3:00pm.

How does the audition process work?

The prospective student and his or her parents or guardians will meet with a staff member for an interview of approximately 15 minutes in length. Due to the student's age, there is no requirement for a formal audition.



Children who participate in the Arts are:

- ❑ Four times more likely to be recognized for academic achievement

- ❑ Three times more likely to win an award for school attendance
- ❑ Participate in youth groups nearly four times as frequently
- ❑ Read for pleasure nearly twice as often
- ❑ Perform community service more than four times as often
